Transition pathway to climate-smart resilient landscapes



Identify highly erodible land to be converted to native forest

- Mana whenua knowledge of the land
- Land-use capability map for whenua Māori: WhenuaViz
- Map of observed erosion: Observed Erosion



Will natural regeneration work here?

- Is there native forest nearby?
 - Mana whenua knowledge of the land
 - Map of current and past vegetation: Explore NZ Landcover Change
 - Map of "potential natural vegetation" and "what the whenua might have looked like before human occupation": Potential Natural Vegetation
- Is there already native shrubs or trees on my land that are spreading?
- How quickly do I want native forest?
- Will I need to plant native trees or can I fence off land and allow native trees to grow?
- There are two types of natural generation:
 - Passive regeneration fencing out of grazing animals and pest control will lead to forest naturally returning
 Active regeneration planting of native trees required as well as fencing out of grazing animals and pest control
- If your identified land is currently pasture, the map of potential reforestation on marginal land, may tell you whether passive or active regeneration will work for you



Identify support

- Will harvesting the pines on your land make enough money to fund fencing, weed and pest control, and planting of native trees [if required]?
- What funding support is available for natural regeneration? Enquire with your:
 - Iwi and hapū
 - Local councils
 - Central government agencies
 - Local environmental groups
